Project-Based Learning 101: A Three-Day Workshop for Teachers and Leaders Three Opportunities in Summer 2015

The **PBL 101 Workshop** is a foundational three-day workshop for Project Based Learning as a model of student-centered, inquiry based learning in schools. It provides participants with the skills and knowledge needed to design, assess, and manage a rigorous, relevant, and standards-based project. The workshop models the project process. Facilitated by a national expert from the faculty of the Buck Institute for Education headquartered in California, the workshop is a balanced blend of direct instruction, video analysis, hands-on work, resource sharing, and peer collaboration and feedback.

Participants are actively engaged in project design, with the expectation that teams of participants will generate a project plan that receives formative feedback from both participants and Buck Institute National Faculty. All participants (limited to 35 per workshop) will receive a copy of Buck Institute's PBL 101 workbook.
